

GOOD FENG SHUI HOMEBUYING CHECKLIST

This checklist will help if you're looking to buy or build a home and you don't want to compromise on harmony and balance. This is not meant to be an exhaustive list of all that is good or bad in Feng Shui. Avoiding homes that don't keep with the checklist below is your best option because such home issues are difficult to remedy. More details can be found on my website. HOME LOCATION	
	Not on a corner lot, T-intersection, dead-end, or cul-de-sac
	No major power lines or cell towers nearby
	Not on a cliff
	No large bodies of water behind or just in front
	Not below street level
	No large trees at front door
	Front door visible from street
	Front door not directly facing neighbors' doors
HOME SHAPE ALIGNS WITH BAGUA	
	Top-down view is generally rectangular in shape
	Front door aligns with outside wall of rectangular shape (not recessed)
	No missing sections of rectangular shape (L-shape, C-shape, etc.)
	Nothing protruding from rectangular shape (except garages)
	No open-air courtyards in middle of the home
INSIDE THE HOME	
	No view of bathroom or kitchen from front door
	Front door and back door not directly aligned
	Front door does not immediately open to stairs, another door, or wall
	No spiral or grand staircases in the house
	Bedrooms are at back of house
NEXT STEPS	
	Make an offer with an inspection contingency
